> *The publicly provided information on the permitting of the gun range did not include mention of semi-automatic, automatic and assault-style weapons, which information would have concerned many public members and did concern many public members when they learned of it.

*The JMA may have plans for addressing the public health and safety of the gun range, but lack of public knowledge of such measures is of concern to VFP and to many members of the public.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties do hereby agree as follows:

1. The Commission will notice and hold one or more public hearings on the JMA's application for a conditional use permit, as though the Assembly had remanded the matter. The scope of the hearing(s) will be limited to issues of public health and safety in and around the gun range. The Commission will invite one or more public safety representative(s) from the Juneau Police Department and/or other public safety experts and one or more public health expert(s) (e.g., mental health clinician, pediatrician, epidemiologist, etc.) to attend, and to speak at, the hearing.

2. JMA agrees to attend such hearing(s), and to submit a written plan to explain to the Commission, and to the public, the health and safety plans for the gun range, to include architectural security features, staff background and training and certification requirements, customer controls (e.g., background checks, psychological challenges, age restrictions, etc.), and firearms training plans, including instructor qualifications, definition of training equipment. JMA further agrees to comply with any health and safety recommendations (or permit conditions) that may be imposed by the Commission, as instructed by the testimony of law enforcement and public health professionals.
