(the non-profit responsible for building Fireweed Place as housing for seniors), and still found time to be a charter member of the National Federation of Federal Employees, serve in the Society of Human Resources Management Association, as well as the CBJ Historic Resources Advisory Committee, the Gastineau Channel Historical Society, and the Pioneers of Alaska, serving on the committee that published three volumes of the *Gastineau Channel Memories*; and

WHEREAS, Marie has been honored with other awards recognizing her time and service to her community and state, including AARP for her many years of dedicated service, it is the intent by this proclamation to particularly honor her for her continued passionate volunteerism and undeniable amazing energy in serving Juneau's seniors now and for the future; and
