### THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY CHARGES:

### COUNT I:

That in the First Judicial District, State of Alaska, on or about May 15, 2016, at or near Excursion Inlet, MARK ANTHONY DE SIMONE intentionally caused the death of another person.

All of which is a Felony class U offense being contrary to and in violation of 11.41.100(a)(1)(A) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

### COUNT II:

That in the First Judicial District, State of Alaska, on or about May 15, 2016, at or near Excursion Inlet, MARK ANTHONY DE SIMONE with intent to cause serious physical injury to another person or knowing that the conduct was substantially certain to cause death or serious physical injury to another person, caused the death of any person.

All of which is a Felony class U offense being contrary to and in violation of 11.41.110(a)(1) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

### COUNT III:

That in the First Judicial District, State of Alaska, on or about May 15, 2016, at or near Excursion Inlet, MARK ANTHONY DE SIMONE knowingly engaged in conduct that resulted in the death of another person under circumstances manifesting an extreme indifference to the value of human life.

All of which is a Felony class U offense being contrary to and in violation of 11.41.110(a)(2) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

### COUNT IV:

That in the First Judicial District, State of Alaska, on or about May 15, 2016, at or near Excursion Inlet, MARK ANTHONY DE SIMONE recklessly caused the death of another person.

All of which is a Felony class A offense being contrary to and in violation of 11.41.120(a)(1) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

### COUNT V:

That in the First Judicial District, State of Alaska, on or about May 15, 2016, at or near Excursion Inlet, MARK ANTHONY DE SIMONE with criminal negligence, caused the death of another person.

All of which is a Felony class B offense being contrary to and in violation of 11.41.130 and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

The undersigned swears under oath this Information is based upon a review of police report AK16035087 submitted to date.

On May 15, 2016, at approximately 7:38 p.m., the Alaska State Troopers received a report from the United States Coast Guard that there had been a report of a person shot in the head in Excursion Inlet, which is located approximately 25 miles north of Hoonah. USCG reported that they received a call on VHF radio requesting that Troopers respond after a male subject had been shot in the head. Troopers arrived by aircraft at Excursion Inlet at approximately 9:19 p.m.

Upon arrival, Trooper Ryan Anderson observed six men standing on the beach in front of a cabin. Four of the men had their hands above their heads. One man was sitting on a rock away from the others, and the last man was the person who had called the USCG, who was securing the scene. Trooper Anderson identified the man on the rock as MARK DE SIMONE, whom initial reports had identified as the shooter. One of the men

Trooper Anderson located a male lying in a pool of blood under a picnic table outdoors. The male was later identified as Duilio Antonio "Tony" Rosales by his Alaska identification. Rosales had what appeared to be two gunshot wounds, approximately one inch apart, to the back of his head. Trooper Anderson observed what appeared to be exit wounds on Rosales' left cheek, approximately two to three inches apart. Rosales was obviously deceased. Rosales appeared to have been sitting on the picnic bench removing his boots when he was shot and rolled onto the ground. There was blood spatter on the railing of the deck, on the bench of the table, and there was a large pool of blood underneath his head. Trooper Anderson also observed that Rosales was wearing an empty holster on his right hip.

Trooper Anderson conducted an interview with Seth Bradshaw, who was on the scene when the shooting occurred. Seth Bradshaw stated that he was urinating behind the cabin just in the woods at approximately 7:00 p.m. when he heard what he believed to be two gunshots. Seth Bradshaw stated that he initially thought the gunshots came from someone target shooting, but as he walked to the front of the cabin, he ran into DE SIMONE. Bradshaw stated that DE SIMONE told him, "I shot Tony. I shot him. It's my fault."

Seth Bradshaw stated that he called for his brother, Samuel Bradshaw, who was hunting in the woods behind the cabin. Seth Bradshaw said that DE SIMONE wanted to walk into the woods, but that Seth Bradshaw made him stay. Samuel Bradshaw reported that he returned from the woods and Seth Bradshaw told him that Tony was shot and looked like he was dead. Samuel Bradshaw stated that he saw DE SIMONE walking on a trail next to the cabin. Samuel Bradshaw stated that DE SIMONE was mumbling something to the effect that he shot Tony, but that he could not make out what DE SIMONE was saying.
