





### **Student Achievement**

Over the past few years, the 4-year graduation rate has increased from 71% to 79%. The graduation rate for Alaska Native students rose from 51% to 71%.

Using our grade K-10 Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) data, we can see that many of our students are doing well - 63% are meeting national standards in reading and 61% in math.





### **Our Budget**

JSD has an annual budget of approximately \$93 million (\$78 million operating fund, \$14 million special revenue funds, and \$1 million activity funds).



### **Our City**

Juneau, Alaska's capital city, is the third largest city in the state and one of the most beautiful state capitals in the nation. Juneau is located in the Panhandle of Southeast Alaska in the Tongass National Forest, the largest temperate rainforest in North America, which offers a wealth of outdoor recreational opportunities. Only accessible by sea and air, Juneau is 900 air miles north of Seattle and 600 air miles southeast of Anchorage. The population of Juneau is about 33,000.

### **Our District**

The Juneau School District is the fifth largest district in the State of Alaska. The Juneau School District is home to approximately 4,800 public school students, with six elementary schools, two middle schools, two high schools, an alternative high school and a K-8 Charter School. Other unique district programs include Montessori Borealis, HOMEBridge home school, and a Tlingit Culture Language and Literacy program.

One in five of the district's students are of Alaska Native heritage. In the district, about one in four students receive free or reduced lunch and about 17% receive special education services. About nine percent of students are English Language Learners and seven percent are in the Extended Learning program for gifted and talented students.

The Juneau School District is one of the largest employers in the community, with about 680 full time employees, 373 of which are certified teachers. The attendance rate for students is 91% and staff attendance rate is 88%.
