**Voluntary Commercial Recycling Rate established 2007







2018 – Current program 2500 tons diverted

2019/20 – Consolidate, increase drop boxes, add business program 5000 tons diverted

2020/21 – Add compost 8000 tons diverted

2023 – Universal Recycling and Composting regulation and source reduction 16000 tons diverted

*SWMS report says 60% diversion possible from Juneau waste stream. Whitehorse diversion goal is 50%.
